About

Higher education institutions can provide an important contribution to global and regional agendas such as the <u>Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)</u>, the <u>Paris Agreement of 2015</u>, and the <u>European Green</u> <u>Deal</u>. Greening of higher education is also a priority of the European Union and is defined as "*increasing awareness and taking concrete action towards a green, environmentally friendly, and resource-efficient university. This involves addressing the university's mission, campus, and its members while contributing to its larger community and surroundings. It may or may not be part of a broader approach to tackle the SDGs and contribute to the 2030 Agenda.*"¹

This is increasingly recognised by governments and higher education leaderships, who strive to enhance governance, teaching methodologies and student engagement. The aim is to better prepare students, staff and teachers, fostering stronger commitments and encouraging them to act as advocates for sustainability while actively engaging in green initiatives. The recent organization of the <u>Conference of the Parties (COP28) to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)</u> marked another important moment in this process.

Under the SPHERE initiative, work has been proceeding to highlight the concept of greening in higher education and showcasing examples of its integration into national policies and institutional practices in HERE countries².

The present HERE virtual study visit on "Institutional approaches and strategies for greening" presents the case of <u>University College Cork</u> (UCC) in the broader Irish and European context. The 'virtual visit' aims to highlight UCC's comprehensive approach to sustainability and greening, particularly how it is integrated into its institutional mission and practices, such as its Green Campus strategy. The visit will address the issue in the context of research, education, governance & administration, internationalisation, and digitalisation. Furthermore, the visit will explore the impact of greening

Objectives

The objectives of this HERE study visit are:

- Gain insights into UCC's institutional approaches and strategies for integrating sustainability and greening into its policies and practices, including teaching and learning, digitalization, curriculum design, research, services to society/ outreach, international collaboration, governance and campus management.
- Understand how UCC's green strategy engages with diverse stakeholders within and outside the institution, including civil society, the private sector, the public sector, youth.
- Explore Ireland's national strategy for greening in higher education and how it relates to the European context, showcasing challenges and successes of incorporating sustainable practices within the Irish higher education context.
- Discuss how national strategies can address the role of higher education in contributing to environmental sustainability and also enable this.
- Understand, at both institutional and national levels, how these initiatives align with broader frameworks such as the SDGs and the European Green Deal, and also how Erasmus is used in this regard.
